Late submissions will be considered as the first strike in your commitment as an editor of *The Stentorian*. Please note that while section editor positions have been released, they are not permanent. Once the Newspaper Forum in the fall semester is in session, editors are welcome to try out different sections and cement their decisions by mid-September. Editors are welcome to express interest in multiple of the finalized sections (the sections listed on our website are our finalized sections). However, editors will not be able to hold more than one position.

Agreements:

1. Meeting Schedules:
 - a. For the entire masthead: Meets on the first _____ of each month
 - i. Purpose: Round robin of updates, story ideas, work-in-progress, meeting deadlines; completing the production ladder for every issue 1 month in advance.
 - b. For editors-in-chief: Every _____ of the week
 - c. Specific day of the week and time will be determined after everyone gets their schedules for the semester.
2. Absences/No-Shows
 - a. Because you have applied to be a part of our team, everyone commits their time and effort to ensuring The Stentorian runs smoothly and representatively. Every absence to a meeting must be reported and acknowledged by an editor-in-chief at least 24 hours in advance. Later that night, meeting notes and recap will be sent out.
 - b. It will be considered a no-show if: 1) you do not report your absence to anyone; 2) you do not reply to relevant emails/text messages within 24 hours (if it is urgent, reply as soon as possible); or 3) the editors-in-chief or advisor receive a complaint from another student/editor about your work ethic/any inappropriate attitude.
 - c. 3 No-Shows result in a dismissal and removal from the masthead.
 - d. If you do not respond to anything within a week, that will result in a dismissal and removal from the masthead.
 - e. Vacant spots will then be open for anybody in the student body to apply.
3. Maintaining Professionalism
 - a. When you/whoever has a story idea for a section, run it through the corresponding EIC and keep them updated through as many steps in the contacting, interviewing, writing, and editing process as possible. These processes will be transparent.

- b. When reaching out for interviews, be mindful of how you represent yourself, the school, and the newspaper.
- c. Whenever a social media post is published by @ncssm.stentorian, please repost and spread the news in an appropriate manner.

4. Following Editorial Guidelines
 - a. Please see the [Editorial Planning and Operations Management Manual \(EPOMM\)](#) for a comprehensive list of guidelines.
5. It is highly recommended to attend the Newspaper Forum this fall semester for an introduction to journalism and complete training (including trying out section writing and editing). This will also be the requirement for being approved to write your own posts and creating your own account on Wordpress.
